- Pentacel (DaPT#1/HIB #1/IPV #1)
- Prevnar #1
- Rotateq oral #1

Medications: You may offer Infant Tylenol 0.4 dropper
www.tylenol.com Now and again in 4-6hrs.

Be aware the Tylenol concentration has changed.

Do not offer your baby any other medicine without calling our office. Tylenol is toxic, do not give for teething at this age. Do not give Motrin.

Nasal congestion can be relieved by upright positioning,

Ocean nose drops to clear secretions and your bulb syringe.

- Place baby on a firm safe surface at least 4 times/day for "tummy time"
- Try not to offer cereal or solid foods until 4 months
- Call office for fever >101.
- Nurse advice 210-22-NURSE 1-877-647-7440
- Bring IMMUNIZATION RECORD to all well child visits.

By 3 months of age does your child:

- lift head and chest when lying on his stomach
- turn head from side to side when lying on his stomach
- follow a moving object or person with his eyes
- often hold hands open or loosely fist
- grasp rattle when given to her
- wiggle and kick with arms and legs

SENSATION:

- turn head toward bright colors and lights
- turn toward the sound of your voice
- Recognize breast or bottle
- Respond to shaking of a rattle

Language and Social Skills

- make cooing, gurgling sounds
- smile when smiled at
- communicate hunger, fear, discomfort (through crying or facial expression)
- usually quiet down at the sound of a soothing voice or when held
- anticipate being lifted
- react to "peek-a-boo" games Learn the Signs, ACT EARLY
